1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular session of the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners Complaint Screening Committee was called to order by Chairman Shreeve at 9:02 a.m. on February 8, 2017.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- a. Dr. Beljan made a motion, seconded by Ms. Shreeve, to approve the January 18, 2017, Regular Session meeting minutes as drafted. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a. Julie Landry Poole, Ph.D., Complaint No. 15-38

Ms. Shreeve summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Board was the Complainant in this matter. The Licensee was not present. The

Licensee's attorney, Steven Perlmutter, was present and made a brief statement. Committee members had no questions. After deliberation, Dr. Beljan made a motion, seconded by Dr. Flowers, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

b. Harriet Smith, Ph.D., Complaint No. 16-38

Dr. Flowers summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present, made a statement, and answered Committee member questions. The Licensee and her attorney, Faren Akins, were present, made brief statements, and answered Committee member questions. After deliberation, Dr. Flowers made a motion, seconded by Dr. Beljan, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

c. Nicole Taylor, Ph.D., Complaint No. 16-42

Dr. Flowers recused from this matter. Dr. Beljan summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee was present and made a brief statement. Committee members had no questions. After deliberation, Ms. Shreeve made a motion, seconded by Dr. Beljan, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (2-0-1), by a voice vote, with Dr. Flowers recused.

d. Milena Howell, Ph.D., Complaint No. 16-48

Dr. Flowers summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee and her attorney, Susan McLellan, were present and Ms. McLellan made a brief statement. Licensee answered Committee member questions. After deliberation, Dr. Flowers made a motion, seconded by Dr. Beljan, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

e. Lisa Isaac, Ph.D., Complaint No. 16-43

Dr. Beljan summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee was present and answered Committee member questions.

At 10:32 a.m., Dr. Beljan made a motion, seconded by Dr. Flowers, to move into Executive Session to discuss confidential records.

At 10:43 a.m., the Committee returned to open session for deliberation of the case.

After deliberation, Dr. Flowers made a motion, seconded by Dr. Beljan, to forward this case to the full Board for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-2061(15)(o), for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice; and A.R.S. §32-2061(15)(dd), for possibly violating an ethical standard adopted by the Board, as it pertains to the American Psychological Association's 2002 Ethical Standards of Psychologists and Code of Conduct, Standard 9.01, Bases for Assessments. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

f. Kristine Autry, Ed.D., Complaint No. 16-49

Ms. Shreeve summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee and her attorney, Kenneth Baker, were present and made brief statements. The Licensee answered Committee member questions. After deliberation, Ms. Shreeve made a motion, seconded by Dr. Beljan, to forward this case to the full Board for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-2061(15)(o), for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice; and A.R.S. §32-2061(15)(dd), for possibly violating an ethical standard adopted by the Board, as it pertains to the American Psychological Association's 2002 Ethical Standards of Psychologists and Code of Conduct, Standard 9.01, Bases for Assessments, and Standard 3.04, Avoiding Harm. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

5. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Committee, Dr. Beljan made a motion, seconded by Dr. Flowers, to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried (3-0) and the meeting was adjourned at 11:17 a.m.
