1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular session of the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners Complaint Screening Committee was called to order by Madame Chair Shreeve at 8:30 a.m. on October 10, 2018. No Executive Sessions were held.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- September 26, 2018, Regular and Executive Session Minutes

Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. Bohanske, to approve the September 26, 2018, Regular and Executive Session minutes as drafted. The motion carried 3-0.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a. Kim Johnson, Ph.D., Complaint No. 18-09

Dr. Bohanske summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Licensee and the Licensee's attorney, Larry Cohen, Esq.,

were present. Mr. Cohen requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Licensee answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage, to dismiss this matter as there are no violations of rule or statute. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

b. Michael Johnson, Ph.D., Complaint No. 18-11

Ms. Shreeve recused from reviewing this Complaint and exited the meeting room.

Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee and the Licensee's attorney, Mandi Karvis, Esq., were present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. Bohanske, to forward Complaint No. 18-11 to the Board for possible violation of A.R.S. §32-2061(16)(f) for possible sexual intimacies or sexual intercourse with a current client or patient or a supervisee or with a former client or patient within two years after the cessation or termination of treatment. For the purposes of this subdivision, "sexual intercourse" has the same meaning prescribed in section 13-1401; A.R.S. §32-2061(16)(l) for possibly practicing psychology while impaired or incapacitated to the extent and in a manner that jeopardizes the welfare of the client or patient or renders the psychological services provided ineffective; A.R.S. §32-2061(o) for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice and A.R.S. §32-2061(dd) for possibly violating an ethical standard adopted by the board as it pertains to the American Psychological Association Ethical Principles and Code of Conduct 2.01 (Boundaries of Competence) and 3.05 (Multiple Relationships). The motion carried 2-0-1 with Ms. Shreeve recused.

c. Craydon McDonald, Complaint No. 18-16

Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Licensee and the Licensee's attorney, Mark Harrison, Esq., were present. Mr. Harrison made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Licensee answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Ms. Shreeve, to dismiss this matter as there are no violations of rule or statute. The motion carried 2-1 with Dr. Brundage voting no.

d. Theodore Etling, Psy.D., Complaint No. 18-20

Ms. Shreeve summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Licensee was not present. After deliberation, it was the consensus of the Committee to table this matter to a future meeting. The Committee directed Board staff to request that the Licensee be present at the meeting in which Complaint No. 18-20 will be heard.

5. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Committee, Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage, to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried (3-0) and the meeting was adjourned at 11:11 a.m.
