1. CALL TO ORDER

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- a. Dr. Wechsler made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage, to approve the September 14, 2016, Regular Session meeting minutes as drafted. Motion carried (2-0-1), by a voice vote, with Mr. Robichaud abstaining.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a. Javier Perez, Ph.D. RFI 16-26

Dr. Wechsler summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee was present and answered Committee

member questions. After deliberation, Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. Wechsler, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

b. Sarah Petty, Psy.D, RFI 16-27

Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee and her attorney, Charles Hover, were present. Committee members had no questions. After deliberation, Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. Wechsler, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

c. Daniel Juliano, Ph.D., RFI 16-28

Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. Neither the Complainant, nor the Licensee, was present. Committee members discussed concerns related to the absence of a written informed consent, signed by the examinee, specific to the evaluation performed by the Licensee. The Committee further discussed the importance of obtaining written informed consent, even when an evaluation is authorized by and conducted for a third party client, as in the current case. After deliberation, Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. Wechsler, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

d. Melissa Huie, Psy.D., RFI T-16-25

Mr. Robichaud summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Respondent was present and answered Committee member questions. The Respondent's employer was present and made a brief statement. After deliberation, Mr. Robichaud made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage, to dismiss the complaint, identifying no violations. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

5. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Committee, Mr. Robichaud made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage, to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried (3-0) and the meeting was adjourned at 10:10 a.m.
