1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular session of the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners Complaint Screening Committee was called to order by Chairman Wechsler at 9:00 a.m. on December 14, 2016.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- a. Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. Wechsler, to approve the October 12, 2016, Regular Session meeting minutes as drafted. Motion carried (2-0-1), by a voice vote, with Ms. Shreeve abstaining.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a. Barrie Wagner, Psy.D. RFI 16-23

Dr. Wechsler summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainants were present. One of the Complainants made a brief statement and

answered Committee member questions. The Licensee and her attorney, Flynn Carey, Esq., were present, made brief statements, and answered Committee member questions. After deliberation, Dr. Wechsler made a motion, seconded by Ms. Shreeve, to forward the case to the full Board for further review for possible violation of Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S.”) § 32-2061(o), for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice, and possible violation of Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S.”) § 32-2061(dd), for possibly violating an ethical standard adopted by the Board, as it pertains to the American Psychological Association’s 2002 Ethical Standards of Psychologists and Code of Conduct, Standard 9.01, Bases for Assessments, parts (a), (b), and (c). The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

b. Solomon Grossman, Ph.D, RFI 16-36

Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was not present. The Licensee and his attorney, Michelle Khazai, Esq. were present. Committee members had no questions. After deliberation, Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Ms. Shreeve, to dismiss the complaint upon finding no violation of statute or rule. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

c. Sandra Brim, Ph.D., RFI 16-33

Dr. Brundage recused from this matter. Ms. Shreeve summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Board was the Complainant in this matter. The Licensee and her attorney, Faren Akins, Esq., were present, made brief statements, and answered Committee member questions. After deliberation, Dr. Wechsler made a motion, seconded by Ms. Shreeve, to forward the case to the full Board for further review for possible violation of Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S.”) § 32-3208(A), which requires a health professional who has been charged with a misdemeanor involving conduct that may affect patient safety or a felony after receiving or renewing a license or certificate to notify the health professional's regulatory board in writing within ten working days after the charge is filed. The motion carried unanimously (2-0-1), by a voice vote, with Dr. Brundage recused.

5. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Committee, Ms. Shreeve made a motion, seconded by Dr. Weschler, to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried (2-0) and the meeting was adjourned at 10:12 a.m.
