1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular session of the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners Complaint Screening Committee was called to order by Madame Chair Shreeve at 8:30 a.m. on February 19, 2020. One Executive Session was held.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- January 15, 2020, Regular Session and Executive Session

Dr. Flowers recused from this item. Dr. Davis-Wilson made a motion, seconded by Ms. Shreeve, to approve the January 15, 2020, regular session and executive session minutes as drafted. The motion carried unanimously (2-0), by a voice vote.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a. **Connie Pyburn, Ph.D., Complaint No. 20-20**

Dr. Flowers summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present telephonically, made a statement and answered questions posed by Committee members. The Licensee and her attorney, Flynn Carey, Esq., were present, made a statement, and answered Committee members' questions.

Dr. Flowers made a motion, seconded by Dr. Davis-Wilson, to forward Complaint 20-20 to the Board for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-2061(16)(h), for possibly failing or refusing to maintain and retain adequate business, financial or professional records pertaining to the psychological services provided to a client or patient; A.R.S. § 32-2061(16)(o), for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice; and A.R.S. §32-2061(16)(dd), for possibly violating an ethical standard adopted by the Board as it pertains to section 3.10 (Informed Consent) of the American Psychological Association's Ethical Principles of Psychologist and Code of Conduct. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

b. **Shanna Sadeh, Ph.D., Complaint No. 20-14**

Ms. Shreeve summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present, made a statement and answered questions posed by Committee members. The Licensee and the Licensee's attorney, Mark Harrison, Esq., were present, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions.

Ms. Shreeve made a motion to forward Complaint 20-14 to the Board for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-2061(16)(h), for possibly failing or refusing to maintain and retain adequate business, financial or professional records pertaining to the psychological services provided to a client or patient; and A.R.S. § 32-2061(16)(o), for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice. Dr. Davis-Wilson agreed to second the motion with a friendly amendment of possible violation of A.R.S. §32-2061(16)(dd) as it pertains to sections 2.06 (Personal Problems and Conflicts), 3.05 (Multiple Relationships), and 3.10 (Informed Consent). Ms. Shreeve accepted the amended motion. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

c. **Richard Frederick, Ph.D., Complaint No. T-20-04**

Dr. Flowers summarized the case, including salient points of the investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present telephonically, made a statement and answered questions from the Committee members. The Licensee participated telephonically, and the Licensee's attorney, Faren Akins, Esq., appeared in person. The Licensee made a statement and answered Committee members' questions.

After deliberation, Dr. Flowers made a motion, seconded by Dr. Davis-Wilson, to dismiss this matter as there are no violations of rule or statute. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

Dr. Flowers left the meeting at 11:05 a.m.

d. Laura Falduto, Ph.D., Complaint No. 20-21

The Committee recessed at 11:06 a.m. and resumed at 11:09 a.m.

At 11:09 a.m., Ms. Shreeve made a motion, seconded by Dr. Davis-Wilson, to go into Executive Session to receive confidential legal advice. Open session reconvened at 11:14 a.m.

Ms. Shreeve announced complaint nos. 20-21 and 20-19 will be reviewed at a future meeting date, noting these matters are tabled given that the current composition of the Committee does not have a psychologist member pursuant to A.R.S. §32-2081(H).

e. Rachel Ocampo Hoogasian, Ph.D., Complaint No. 20-19

This matter was tabled as noted above.

4. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Committee, Dr. Davis-Wilson made a motion, seconded by Ms. Shreeve, to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried (3-0) and the meeting was adjourned at 11:15 a.m.
