1. CALL TO ORDER

3. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION PERTAINING TO PROGRESS UPDATE ON DRAFTING RULES FOR BEHAVIOR ANALYSTS – Dr. Olvey

Dr. Olvey summarized that rules for behavior analysts are being drafted and should be available for review at the next Rules Committee meeting.

DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION PERTAINING TO DRAFTING RULES FOR PSYCHOLOGY INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO ADDRESSING LEGISLATION PASSED DURING THE 2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION FOR PSYCHOLOGY SUCH AS TELEPRACTICE, TEMPORARY LICENSURE, AND REVISION OF THE CURRENT LICENSE RENEWAL PROCESS

The Committee reviewed revisions to draft telepractice rules and recommended additional revisions pertaining to the risk analysis conducted as clinically indicated. Revisions to the section regarding supervision through telepractice were also identified.

5. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING RULES FOR PSYCHOLOGY EFFECTIVE JANUARY 30, 2016, AND CURRENT RULES FOR PSYCHOLOGY THAT MAY NEED REVISION

Committee members discussed possible edits and corrections to the current rules. The Committee also discussed possible additions to the rules such as, adding instances in which individuals need to apply anew for licensure rather than submitting a reapplication, which would include individuals whose licenses were revoked, expired, cancelled, or retired. Committee members also discussed possibly prorating the number of continuing education hours for individuals who reinstate a license shortly after they fail to renew.
