### **1. CALL TO ORDER**

Chairwoman Davis-Wilson called the Board's meeting to order at 8:32 a.m.

**7. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING PROPOSED LEGISLATION INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO: HB2070, HB2145, HB2147, HB2162, HB2178, HB2196, HB2260, HB2294, HB2371, HB2412, HB2587, HB2599, HB2612, SB1035, SB1045, SB1090, SB1127, SB1158, SB1550, SB1568**

Ms. Paakkonen indicated that she had updates to a few bills. SB1309, a strike-everything amendment bill approved by the Senate Health & Human Services Committee, extends all temporary emergency licenses issued during the COVID state of emergency out to January 1, 2023. She noted that the Board has issued close to 700 such licenses. Ms. Paakkonen indicated that SB1568 establishes several requirements be implemented by licensing boards, most of which this board has previously accomplished. One of the challenging provisions is that the bill would require investigations be completed and presented to the Board

within 180 days (with a possible 100-day extension). Another provision would compel the Board to take disciplinary action against a licensee who reports possible unprofessional conduct by another licensee, but the investigation finds that allegation to be false. Ms. Paakkonen indicated that this could have a chilling effect on reporting concerns to the Board by licensees, and is in conflict with the ethical codes for both regulated professions. Finally, HB2612 removes “good moral character” as a requirement for licensure from all regulated professions. Notably, only the behavior analyst statute currently includes this specific language while the psychology statute only includes language that is somewhat similar. She explained that this bill was filed to comply with a provision of a bill last year that established a “second chance” to qualify for licensure for individuals with a previous criminal history. Finally, Ms. Paakkonen noted that HB2178 passed the House of Representatives with near unanimous support, and is expected to carry the same level of support through the Senate.
