1. CALL TO ORDER

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

a. July 17, 2024 Regular Session and Executive Session Minutes

Dr. Stewart made a motion, seconded by Dr. Medina, to approve the minutes as drafted. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a. Complaint No. 24-36, Danielle Powers, Psy.D.

Dr. Stewart summarized the case, including salient information contained in the investigative record. The Complainant's power of attorney made a statement on his behalf. Dr. Powers was present with her attorney, Brock Heathcotte, made a statement, and answered questions from the Committee. After deliberation, Dr. Stewart made a motion, seconded by Dr. Medina, to dismiss this case, as there are no violations of rule or statute. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.

b. Complaint No. 24-37, Heather Nash, Ph.D.

Dr. Stewart summarized the case, including salient information contained in the investigative record. The Complainant was present and made a statement. Dr. Nash was present with her attorney, Faren Akins, made a statement, and answered questions from the Committee.

After deliberation, Dr. Stewart made a motion, seconded by Dr. Medina, to dismiss this case, as there are no violations of rule or statute. The motion carried unanimously (2-0), by a voice vote.

c. Complaint No. 24-43, Jonna Dunlap, Psy.D.

After deliberation, Dr. Stewart made a motion, seconded by Dr. Medina, to dismiss this case, as there are no violations of rule or statute. The motion carried unanimously (2-0), by a voice vote.

d. Complaint No. 24-28, Mary Ann Lanzilotta, Ph.D.

Dr. Medina summarized the case, including salient information contained in the investigative record. The Complainant was present and made a statement. Dr. Lanzilotta was present with her attorney, Flynn Carey, made a statement, and answered questions from the Committee.

At 9:15 a.m. Dr, Medina made a motion, seconded by Mr. Wynn, to go into Executive Session to receive confidential legal advice. Open session resumed at 9:26 a.m.

Upon resuming in open session, the Committee deliberated the case. Dr. Medina made a motion, seconded by Dr. Stewart, to forward the complaint to the Board for further review regarding a potential violation of A.R.S. § 32-2061(16)(0), providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice. The motion carried unanimously (3-0), by a voice vote.
