CEASE AND DESIST ORDER

On December 13, 2024, the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners ("Board") met in open session for the purposes of determining whether grounds existed to issue a Cease and Desist Order to Deidre Evans ("Respondent").

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent holds a Board Certified Behavior Analyst ("BCBA") certification issued by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board in 2020. Respondent also holds behavior analyst licenses in both Texas and Virginia.

2. Respondent has never held a license with the Board to practice behavior analysis in the State of Arizona. Respondent previously submitted a licensure application to the Board in August 2022. However, Respondent failed to supply the required documentation in response to a notice of deficiency and that application was administratively closed in 2023. With respect to that application, Respondent indicated, "I did initially began [*sic*] the licensure process in 2022 as I was planning to move and accepted employment with an ABA company in Arizona, and as apart of onboarding process they submit [*sic*] an application for licensure, I did not move forward with the position at that time as I had some health issues and was no longer in a position to transition jobs and relocate."

3. In January 2024, the Board received a complaint against Respondent and other individuals alleging, in part, that Respondent was currently working (in a remote capacity) for a behavior analytic company based in Arizona called Swan Therapy Group ("Agency. In that role, she was the treating behavior analyst for an Arizona client and signed off on a client's treatment plan as an "LBA" despite not holding a license to practice in Arizona. Documentation submitted

with the complaint demonstrated that Respondent completed the client's assessment and was the primary BCBA overseeing their treatment. The complaint expressed concern that Respondent is the treating provider for several other clients at Agency. Respondent worked in the capacity of BCBA at Agency from July 2023 – June 2024. Respondent's employment with Agency ended approximately six months after the filing of this complaint.

4. On September 27, 2024 and December 6, 2024, the Board's Committee on Behavior Analysts ("Committee") reviewed the complaint. Respondent was present on both occasions and answered questions regarding her role, duties, and services provided at Agency. Respondent acknowledged that she provided behavior analytic services to multiple other clients during her time at Agency. The Committee determined that while the investigative record contains information reflecting Respondent's attempt to seek clarification from her employer at the onset of her employment about licensure requirements, she ultimately did not do her due diligence in reviewing Arizona statutes and rules that would have informed her of such requirements. Respondent stated she assumes responsibility for her decision to provide behavior analytic services in Arizona without having been granted a license to do so. After deliberation, the Committee voted to forward the complaint to the full board with a recommendation that Respondent be issued a Cease and Desist Order for practicing behavior analyst in the State of Arizona, in violation on A.R.S. § 32-2091.12. At its public meeting on December 13, 2024, the Board accepted the Committee's recommendation to issue this Order.

VIOLATIONS

Respondent's conduct constitutes a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2091.12(A), which provides that it is a class 2 misdemeanor for a person not licensed to engage in the practice of behavior analysis.

<u>ORDER</u>

Under the authority set forth in A.R.S. § 32-3227(C), the Board orders Respondent to immediately Cease and Desist from practicing behavior analysis in the State of Arizona until such time she is licensed to do so. If Respondent continues to engage in such activity in violation of the Board's statutes and rules, the Board may pursue injunctive relief pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2091.11.
