**1. CALL TO ORDER**

The regular session of the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners Complaint Screening Committee was called to order by Chairman Bohanske, at 8:33 a.m. on June 13, 2012.

**3. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION**

**a) David A. Biegen, Ed.D., RFI 11-34**

Dr. DiBacoo summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant and Complainant's legal counsel were present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Respondent's legal counsel, Larry Cohen, was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members'

questions. After deliberation, Dr. DiBacco made a motion, seconded by Mr. Larson, to move this case to the full Board for further review and investigation for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-2061(13)(h) for possibly failing or refusing to maintain and retain adequate business, financial or professional records pertaining to the psychological services provided to a client; A.R.S. §32-2061(13)(o) for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice; and A.R.S. §32-2061(13)(aa) for possibly violating a formal Board order, consent agreement, term of probation, or stipulated agreement. The motion carried on a 3-0 vote.

**b) John D. Mather, Ph.D., RFI 12-15**

Mr. Larson summarized the case, and stated this was a complaint initiated by the Board. The Respondent and the Respondent's legal counsel, Larry Cohen, were present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Dr. DiBacco made a motion, seconded by Dr. Bohanske, to move this case to the full Board for further review and investigation for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-3208(A) for possibly failing to notify the Board within 10 working days after a misdemeanor charge was filed against him. The motion carried on a 3-0 vote.

**c) Eugene S. Cherry, Ph.D., RFI 12-08**

Dr. Bohanske summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Respondent and the Respondent's legal counsel, Larry Cohen, were present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the Respondent. Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Mr. Larson, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 2-1 on a roll call vote with Dr. DiBacco voting no.

**d) Ciara Coultrap, T-12-07**

Dr. Bohanske summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Three members of the public were present, and requested to speak, made statements, and answered Committee members' questions. The respondent was not present. Following deliberation, Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Dr. DiBacco, to move this case to the full Board for further review and investigation for possible violation of A.R.S. §32-2084 by practicing psychology without a license and using any combination of words, initials and symbols that leads the public to believe the person is licensed to practice psychology in this State. The motion carried on a 3-0 vote.

**e) David J. Beckstead, Ph.D., RFI 12-06**

Dr. DiBacco summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Complainant was present telephonically, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Three witnesses were present, one telephonically and two in-person, and requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Respondent was present, requested to speak, made statements, and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the Respondent. Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Dr. DiBacco, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 2-1 on a roll call vote with Mr. Larson voting no.

**f) Andrea L. Graber, Ed.D., RFI 12-16**

Mr. Larson briefly summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records.

Mr. Larson left the meeting at 11:42 a.m.

The Respondent was present telephonically and the Respondent's legal counsel, Faren Akins, was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Dr. DiBacco, to move this case to the full Board for further review and investigation for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-3208(A) for possibly failing to notify the Board within 10 working days after a misdemeanor charge was filed against her. The motion carried on a 2-0 vote, with Mr. Larson absent.

#### **4. ADJOURN**

There being no further business to come before the Committee, a motion to adjourn was made by Dr. DiBacco, seconded by Dr. Bohanske, and unanimously carried 2-0. The meeting adjourned at 11:53 a.m.
