1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular session of the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners Complaint Screening Committee was called to order by Chairman, Larson, at 8:31 a.m. on September 14, 2011. No Executive Sessions were held.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- **April 13, 2011, Regular session**
Regular session minutes from the April 13, 2011, Complaint Screening Committee Meeting were considered for approval. Dr. DiBacco made a motion, seconded by Chairman Larson to approve the minutes. Motion carried 2-0-1 with Dr. Brundage recused.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a.) Alberto J. Texidor, Ph.D. RFI 11-06

Dr. DiBacco summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The complainant was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. Licensee and the licensee's legal council, Mark Harrison, were present, requested to speak, made statements and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the licensee. Dr. DiBacco made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 3-0.

b.) Young B. Lee Ph.D. RFI 11-08

Chairman Larson summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The complainant was not present. The licensee and the licensee's legal counsel, Larry Cohen, were present, requested to speak, made statements and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the licensee. Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. DiBacco, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 3-0.

c.) Anthony H. Luick, Ph.D. RFI 11-18

Chairman Larson summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The complainant was not present. The licensee was present telephonically, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the licensee. Chairman Larson made a motion, seconded by Dr. DiBacco, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 3-0.

d.) Sylvia Doss, Ph.D. RFI 11-13

Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The complainant was not present. The licensee and the licensee's legal counsel, Christine Cassetta, were present, requested to speak, made statements and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the licensee. Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Chairman Larson, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 3-0.

e.) Katrina Buwalda, Psy.D. RFI 11-14

Dr. DiBacco recused from this case. Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The complainant was present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The licensee and the licensee's legal counsel, Sophia Varma, were present, requested to speak, made statements and answered Committee members' questions. After deliberation, Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Chairman Larson, to refer this case to the full Board for further review and investigation. Jeanne Galvin, A.A.G. asked licensee's counsel, Ms. Varma, to petition the court to release the client records. The Committee also requested that Board staff obtain additional information to include a more thorough response from the licensee and to subpoena the client records if necessary. The motion carried 2-0-1 with Dr. DiBacco recused.

f.) Lydia B. Garrett, Ph.D. RFI 11-12

Dr. DiBacco summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. Neither the complainant nor the licensee was present. After deliberation, Dr. DiBacco made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage to refer this case to the full Board for further review and investigation for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-2061(13)(o) for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice; A.R.S. §32-2061(13)(r) for possibly failing to obtain a client's informed and written consent to release personal or otherwise confidential information to another party unless the release is otherwise authorized by law; A.R.S. §32-

2061(13)(dd) for possibly violating an ethical standard adopted by the board by possibly entering into a multiple relationship and for possible lack of an informed consent. The Committee directed Board staff to issue a subpoena to the pediatrician, Dr. Alexander, for records of the minor child to include copies of the original prescription to refer the minor child to a psychologist. The motion carried 3-0.

5. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Committee, a motion to adjourn was made by Dr. Brundage, seconded by Dr. DiBacco, and unanimously carried 3-0. The meeting adjourned at 10:50 a.m.
