1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular session of the Arizona Board of Psychologist Examiners Complaint Screening Committee was called to order by Chairman Bohanske, at 8:30 a.m. on November 9, 2011. One Executive Session was held.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- **November 9, 2011, Regular session**
Regular session minutes from the November 9, 2011, Complaint Screening Committee Meeting were considered for approval. Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Ms. Hunter - Williams to approve the minutes. Motion carried 3-0.
- **November 9, 2011, Executive session**

Executive session minutes from the November 9, 2011, Complaint Screening Committee Meeting were considered for approval. Ms. Hunter-Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage to approve the minutes. Motion carried 3-0.

4. CASE DISCUSSION/DECISION

a.) **Solomon Grossman, Ph.D. RFI 11-30**

Chairman Bohanske summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Licensee and the Licensee's legal counsel, Sophia Varma, were present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Complainant was not present. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the Licensee. Dr. Bohanske made a motion, seconded by Ms. Hunter - Williams, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 2-1 on a roll call vote with Dr. Brundage voting no.

b.) **Daniel Gaughan, Ph.D., RFI 11-20**

Dr. Brundage summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Licensee and the Licensee's legal counsel, Farin Akins and co-counsel Vera Akins, were present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The complainant was not present. After deliberation, Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Ms. Hunter - Williams, to move this case to the full Board for further review and investigation for possible violations of A.R.S. §32-2061(13)(g) for possibly engaging or offering to engage as a psychologist in activities not congruent with the psychologist's professional education, training and experience; A.R.S. §32-2061(13)(o) for possibly providing services that are unnecessary or unsafe or otherwise engaging in activities as a psychologist that are unprofessional by current standards of practice. The motion carried 2-1 on a roll call vote with Dr. Bohanske voting no.

c.) **Jeffrey Fannin, Ph.D. RFI T-11-21 & RFI T-11-28**

Ms. Hunter-Williams summarized these cases, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Respondent was present, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Complainant for RFI T-11-21 was not present. The Complainant for RFI T-11-28 was present, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions.

Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Ms. Hunter - Williams, to move into executive session at 10:09 a.m. to obtain confidential legal advice, public session resumed at 10:28 a.m.

After deliberation, Ms. Hunter – Williams made a motion, seconded by Dr. Brundage, to move this case to the full Board for further review and investigation for the allegations that Dr. Fannin is providing psychological services without being licensed as a psychologist, [Possible violation of A.R.S. §32-2084(A) "It is a class 2 misdemeanor for a person not licensed pursuant to this chapter to engage in the practice of psychology."] The motion carried 3-0 on a roll call vote.

d.) **Thomas Selby, Ph.D. RFI 11-29**

Chairman Bohanske summarized the case, including salient points of investigation and pertinent records. The Licensee and the Licensee's legal counsel, Scott A. Alles, were present, requested to speak, made a statement and answered Committee members' questions. The Complainants were not present. After deliberation, the Committee members found no evidence of violation of statute or rule by the Licensee. Dr. Brundage made a motion, seconded by Dr. Bohanske, to dismiss the case. The motion carried 3-0 on a roll call vote.

5. ADJOURN

There being no further business to come before the Committee, a motion to adjourn was made by Dr. Brundage, seconded by Dr. Bohanske, and unanimously carried 3-0. The meeting adjourned at 11:02 a.m.
